- Make every effort to be a constructive staff member, contributing in every way possible to the health, harmony, and happiness of the Moses Merrill team and to the accomplishment of the mission, goals, and objectives of Moses Merrill.

Specific:

- Store and administer all camper and staff medication.
- Maintain accurate and detailed logs of all medication and medical care administered.
- Maintain a current documentation of problems, diagnosis and treatment for each camper assessed.
- Care for all minor medical needs.
- Assess and inform camp leadership of all medical emergencies and follow emergency procedures to address any emergency situations.
- Be present and assessable during all camp activities.
- Maintain and organize the Wikleman Center and the Health Aid's station and report any needs/concerns to the Program Director.
- Communicate with and teach program leaders/staff regarding participant and camper allergies; medical conditions; blood borne pathogen protection; and medications.
- Conduct periodic inventory of supplies and communicate Program Director for ordering listed items, ensuring timely arrival of supplies.
